

THE TEXAS A-F SCHOOL ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEM

In 2017, the 85th Texas Legislature passed House Bill (HB) 22. Under HB 22, districts and campuses receive letter grades annually in August.

Even though your student's district and school will receive a rating, the following aspects should be reviewed for a comprehensive view to ensure that your student is receiving the best educational experience available.

- Safe and inclusive school environment
- Engaging and interactive learning in the classroom
- Supportive and empowered leaders and teachers
- Equitable opportunities for all students for success after high school
- Active involvement and dedication of parents and community

Every child has unique needs, and as their parent or caregiver, you know best what factors they need to be successful and to achieve their academic potential for their future.

The Texas Accountability A-F letter grades are just one measure of how a school is performing. The letter grades are based on performance on state standardized tests, CCMR (College, Career, and Military Readiness) and graduation rates.

Please contact the campus where your student attends to learn more about your district and campus ratings. Campus Leadership will be able to share the district and campus successes as well as the goals and specific program initiatives for the school year.

To calculate the grade for each campus level, the following are used:
